Today and tomorrow are days set apart by President Wilson under a resolution adopted by congress last July for making contributions for the relief of starving Armenians and it is said that this work will be observed as a ceremony in many parts of the country. The contributions are to be made to the Syrian-Mount Lebanon Relief committee of New York of which Gibran K. Gibran is secretary.

The secretary has named Mrs. Jarmeela Kourban of 24 North Tenth street this city as collector for Phoenix and vicinity and Mrs. Kourban will begin her work this morning. She especially desires that contributions be made by the churches tomorrow. It is urged by the committee, whenever possible, that contributions be offered by checks made pay-

able to the committee.

There is no part of the great region touched by the war where the suffering is more intense than Armenia, where the people are starving by thousands. One of the letters from that stricken country mentioned a question asked by a little Syrian boy, "Mother, will we ever have enough to eat again?"
